SIGNS TO **LOOK FOR**

Is under 18 and engaging in
commercial sex work
Displays fearful, anxious, or submissive behavior
Shows signs of poor hygiene , malnourishment, or fatigue
Shows signs of <i>physical or sexual</i> abuse
Lacks freedom of movement or is heavily monitored
Lacks control over money, identification, or phone
Is dressed inappropriately for the climate or their age
Areas that are <i>suspiciously off limits</i> or have locks

WHAT IS HUMAN TRAFFICKING?

Human trafficking involves the use of force, fraud, or coercion to obtain some type of labor or commercial sex act. While beer distribution employees make deliveries or sales calls, you can serve as the eyes and ears on the ground to help save lives.

FORCE, FRAUD OR COERCION

Physical violence including kidnapping, rape, restraint, and confinement.

False offers of employment; promises of marriage, a better life, or a career.

Threats to victim and/or family; debt bondage; psychological abuse; shame; drugs/alcohol



ANYTHING OF VALUE

Anything promised, given or received including money, alcohol, clothes, accessories, housing, meals, and drugs.



POTENTIAL HUMAN TRAFFICKING SITUATION
